Session Descriptions

Hospice – The Beginning: This session will provide discussion of some of the misunderstandings of hospice care. Attendees will be educated about hospice care and that hospice is more than just care of the dying. Each role of the hospice team will be reviewed showing responsibilities and how each role works together as well as supports each other. Tips for improving relationships when providing hospice care in a nursing home will also be shared.

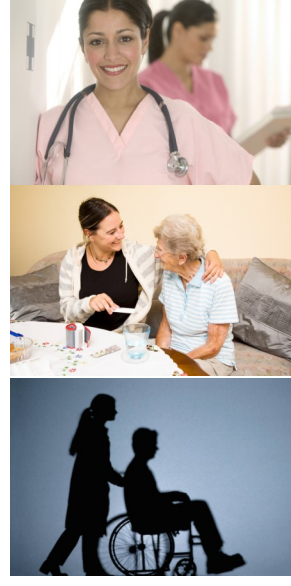
Hospice Patients Rights: The new COPIs address a strong emphasis on the rights and dignity of the patient. This series will address legal issues related to patient care, as well as maintaining their dignity. We will ask the question “What Are Old People For?”

Physical Care of the Hospice Patient: Care of patients at the end of life can be challenging, this series will address techniques for providing alternative methods for delivery of safe and competent care. Presentations on Nutrition, Hydration, Mobility, and Documentation of care will be addressed.

Disease Specific: It is important to have basic knowledge of specific diseases and what effect(s) that disease may have on a patient. This training will include how specific diseases could affect a patient's behavior and techniques the nursing aide can use to promote comfort during care.

End of Life Care: The final phase of care to our patients may be more focused on support to the family/friends/caregivers. Emotional care is as important as physical care during this time. Our care of the patient should be modified to meet everyone's needs. This series we will discuss not only alternative therapies but responding to emotion, alternative therapies and address care of the patient after the death.

Caring For Yourself: We give so much of ourselves while providing care to our patients. During one day or shift there may be physical and emotionally draining situations. To care for our patients we sometimes forget about ourselves. This series will discuss the boundaries of care, caregiver fatigue and how we mourn the loss of our patients.
